- 3. **BluCloud Automated Readers Update-** I spoke with Daniel McCormack of BluCloud on 5/1 to review the performance of the units deployed and the current data hub interface.

4. City & State Agency Updates

- The Boston Water & Sewer Commission (BWSC) has various repair contracts in the design phase, focusing on Lower Beacon Hill, North End, South End, and Back Bay. Anticipated repairs are scheduled for the North End during the upcoming Summer or early Fall season. BWSC continues its investigative work across neighborhoods with low groundwater levels, utilizing televised inspections to detect and repair leaks.
- All City-State Groundwater Working Group partners are actively inspecting manholes, pipes, and sewer laterals within low groundwater level zones. In April, the group convened to share progress updates on their work.
- The Department of Conservation & Recreation (DCR) has outlined plans for the interim rehabilitation of the Storrow Drive underpass. The underpass evaluation will precede contract preparation for bidding, with the projected commencement of work estimated at around 18 months from now. Nightly closures are likely anticipated for the repair operations to enhance safety and efficiency.
