BOSTON GROUNDWATER TRUST (BGwT) BOARD MEETING March 14th, 2024

The Board of Trustees of the Boston Groundwater Trust met in the Patriot meeting room at the Lenox Hotel located at 61 Exeter Street, Boston, MA. The Executive Director electronically distributed the meeting notice and agenda to the City Clerk at Boston City Hall in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Open Meeting Law.

Mr. Robert Whitney, co-chair, read the following statement:

"I, Robert Whitney, co-chair of the Boston Groundwater Trust, am calling this meeting to order at 4:04 pm. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, we are conducting this meeting on-line. To ensure public access to the deliberations of the BOSTON GROUNDWATER TRUST, the public may access this meeting through telephone and video conferencing. 1. Adoption of January 18th, 2024, Board Meeting Minutes

Meeting minutes were previously emailed to Board members for review. Discussion followed.

Mr. Saunders, co-chair, moved to adopt the minutes with the changes discussed at the meeting. Mr. Whitney, co-chair, seconded the motion.

Voted: To adopt the Board meeting minutes for January 18th, 2024.

2. <u>Financial Report</u>

Mr. Whitney, co-chair, and Mr. Simonelli reviewed the Trust's financials. Mr. Whitney, Treasurer, provided an overview of the virtual meeting he and Mr. Simonelli had with Fidelity Investments advisor James McCann, at which they purchased additional bonds. Discussion followed. Trustee Saunders suggested exploring longer-term maturities to take advantage of the current market environment and high interest rates. Discussion followed. Mr. Whitney and Mr. Simonelli will follow up with Fidelity and report back to the Board.

3. FY25 Budget Draft

Mr. Simonelli reviewed the proposed FY25 budget. He noted that Boston Water and Sewer Commission had committed to supporting the BGwT in the amount of \$48k for FY24, of which only \$25k has been received to date; the outstanding amount of \$23k has been promised by June, 2024. Discussion followed. Mr. Simonelli will revise the draft budget and bring it back to the Trustees for a vote at the next Board meeting.

4. <u>Trustee Re-appointments and Term Lengths Update</u>

Following up on the discussion from the last meeting regarding the current two-year term for Trustees, Mr. Simonelli worked with Mr. Whitney to survey existing City of Boston boards and commissions term lengths. Mr. Simonelli provided a list of 43 boards and commissions, 20 of which had term lengths of three years. Discussion followed.

Mr. Whitney will draft language for a proposed modification of the current two-year term for the Trustees to review at the May meeting. In addition, Mr. Whitney will work with Mr. Simonelli to review the Trusts' current by-laws, policies, and nominating entities, and report back to the Board. Discussion followed.

5. <u>Remote Well Reading Device Update</u>

Mr. Simonelli stated that all 30 additional units purchased from BluCloud have been installed throughout the city. Discussion followed. Topics covered included:

- Images of an installed unit.
- 2 of the 30 units are currently not responding and are slated for replacement.
- New cloud interface for public distribution and timeline for release.

6. Current Website Design

Mr. Simonelli reviewed the edits to the current website based on the comments provided by the Trustees at previous Board meetings in November 2023 & January 2024. Discussion followed.

Mr. Simonelli then discussed his impressions of a new website builder, Squarespace, and pre-viewed his updated draft of the new website. Discussion followed. Mr. Simonelli will continue working on the new website and circulate a link to the Board for review and comments to discuss at the May Trustee's meeting. Discussion followed.

7. <u>Executive Director's Report</u>

BGwT Executive Director Mr. Christian Simonelli distributed his report. Discussion followed. Refer to the attached *Executive Director's Report March 14th, 2024*, for a complete list of activities. In addition, Mr. Simonelli reviewed potential speakers for future Trustee meetings. Discussion followed.

8. <u>Other Business</u>

Mr. Mitchell, Trustee, discussed his review of *Reforming the Boston Zoning Code, by: Sara C. Bronin* he circulated to the Trustees which examines and proposes a reform of the zoning code. Discussion followed. Mr. Simonelli will follow up with Mr. Mitchell and report back to the Board at the next meeting.

Ms. Commerford, Secretary, inquired about the next steps for Trustees who have submitted renomination letters to the city. Discussion followed. Mr. Simonelli will follow up and email those Trustees with an update on their renomination status with the city.

Mr. Mitchell moved to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Saunders seconded the motion.
